With almost daily sunshine, a firmly established international events calendar and a wealth of architecture, galleries, museums and festivals, Bahrain provides year-round reasons to visit.

A few highlights:

The Gulf Air Bahrain Formula 1™ Grand Prix, held in early April at the Bahrain International Circuit (BIC), attracts over 90,000 visitors with the region's first night race.

The Bahrain International Circuit also offers Land Rover Experience Bahrain, the first of its kind in the Middle East. It's an exciting off-road thrill with 32 obstacles in the heart of the Sakhir desert.

The biennial **Bahrain International Airshow** takes to the skies in January at the Sakhir airbase. A combined trade and public show, it features one of the region's best aerial displays and many ground-based family attractions.

Our annual **Spring of Culture** and **International Music Festival** draw famous talent in the performing arts from across the Middle East and beyond. Celebrities such as Eric Clapton, John Legend, Joss Stone and Seal have appeared at the historic 15th century Arad Fort.

• Cultural tourism

The Bahrain National Museum houses nine main halls. It classifies and displays the accumulated heritage of Bahrain over several millennia.

A trip to Bahrain is incomplete without an evening at the **National Theatre of Bahrain**. This state-of-the-art venue pays tribute to Bahrain's maritime connections and brings leading artists from around the globe year-round.

One of the world's largest mosques, **Al Fateh**, accommodates up to 7,000 people and is crowned with the largest fiberglass dome anywhere.

Formerly the residence of a prominent pearl merchant, the **Bin Matar House** was built in 1905. It's a unique example of Bahraini architecture, with palm tree roof struts and coral stone walls.

The elegant restored houses of the **Muharraq Quarter** showcase different aspects of Bahrain's rich heritage.

Situated on the UNESCO World Heritage Pearling Trail, **Siyadi House** is the home of a well-known 19th century pearl merchant, and is still occupied by the family. Visitors can see pearling heritage displays, together with objects from the family collection.

Bahrain's **Tree of Life** is around 400 years old and stands on top of a 7.6 meter-high sandy tell (or wall) that formed around a 500-year-old fortress.

Bahrain's rich trading history is reflected in numerous archaeological digs around the island. **Bahrain Fort** is amongst the most exciting of them all and is registered as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



• A shopping paradise

These range from modern malls that feature major brands and designer boutiques with the latest fashions, to vibrant, colourful souqs where you can pick up anything from local fabrics and jewellery, to foods and spices, electronics and antiques.

Manama Souq is the larger of the capital's two souqs, with the historic landmark Bab Al Bahrain as its entrance. **Muharraq Souq** has a section forming part of the Pearling Trail, a World Heritage Site.
