I. Executive Summary

Cost of Living

The cost of living report provides an overview of select cost-of-living indicators benchmarked across Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, the UAE and Oman. The cost indicators benchmarked for the purpose of this study include accommodation, residential utility, vehicle and fuel, education and domestic help.

Figure A below outlines the estimated overall annual cost of living assuming the following scenario:

- Accommodation: Two bedroom furnished apartment
- Utilities: For an expatriate household of four individuals. Assuming monthly consumption of 4,500kWh of electricity and 45m³ of water; one standard 18kg LPG cylinder; one residential PSTN connection (cost for 60 calls per residence per month) and mobile phone connection (cost for 900 calls + 2GB data usage per user per month)
- Vehicle and Fuel: Assuming a household owns a Audi A4 and a Toyota Camry. Annual cost is obtained by depreciating the cost of vehicles over five years period; for fuel cost it is assumed that the two vehicles use Gasoline 91
- Education: For a British curriculum school where one child is in year 3 and another in year 9 of education
- **Domestic Help:** Assuming one domestic help for the household

Based on the parameters taken to arrive at the estimated annual cost of living, Bahrain emerges as the most competitive destination. Compared to Bahrain, the annual cost of living in Saudi Arabia is around 11% to 44% higher. The UAE on average emerges 67% to 77% higher and Oman 51% higher than Bahrain.





Figure A: Indicative Annual Cost of Living (USD)






II. Cost of Living

2.1 Accommodation Cost

Cost of accommodation has been estimated for a range of accommodation types across select cities in Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, UAE and Oman. Saudi Arabia and Bahrain emerge as the most competitive destinations for renting an accommodation.

2.2 Residential Utility Cost

Figure 2 below provides the estimated cost of monthly electricity and water consumption for a typical household of four individuals across select cities in Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, UAE and Oman. Oman is the most competitive in terms of monthly consumption cost of electricity; whereas Saudi Arabia emerges as the most competitive in terms of monthly consumption cost of water.

LPG

Figure 4 below shows the cost per kg of LPG for household use. The cost of LPG is lowest in Bahrain followed by Oman and Saudi Arabia.

Telecommunication

Across residential fixed voice and mobile calls Bahrain is the most competitive. Overall Saudi Arabia is the most expensive for fixed voice and Oman for mobile usage.

Fuel

Bahrain offers the most competitive cost for Gasoline 91 and Gasoline 95. The cost of diesel in Saudi Arabia is the lowest among the benchmarked countries. The cost of diesel in Bahrain is around 50% lower than in the UAE and Oman.

2.4 Education Cost

Cost of Schooling

Cost for schooling is the most competitive in Bahrain and Dammam. Figure 8 below presents the typical annual tuition fee cost for a British curriculum school across the benchmarked countries.

The annual cost of domestic help visa is most competitive in the UAE and Bahrain. Annual cost for the visa is significantly higher in Saudi Arabia and Oman.
